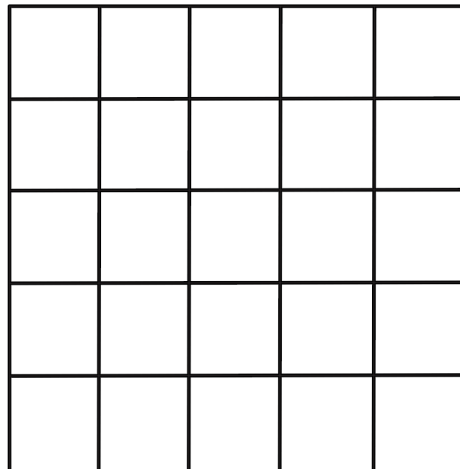
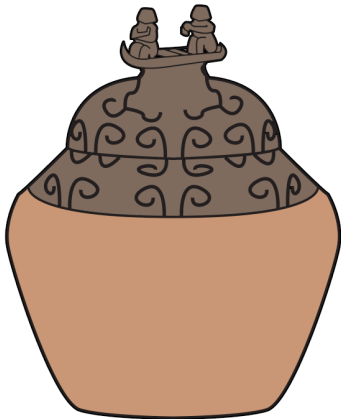
## DID YOU KNOW?

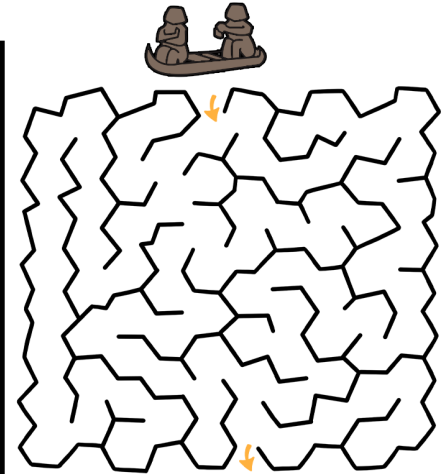
## DRAW THE MANUNGGUL JAR

## TO THE AFTERLIFE

The Manunggul Jar was found in a cave in Lipuun Point, Palawan shows two people riding a boat. The person holding the oar serves as the guide to the next life while the person in front with his arms crossed represents the dead. This indicates a belief in the afterlife and an affinity for maritime voyages by our ancestors. Currently, the Manunggul Jar is displayed at the National Museum of Anthropology.
